

Sarah Gaichas has been an ecosystem modeler with the Ecosystem Assessment Program at the NMFS Northeast Fisheries Science Center in Woods Hole since September 2011, where she has been appointed to ecosystem-based management development teams for both the New England and Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Councils. She previously worked at the NMFS Alaska Fisheries Science Center in Seattle, WA from 1997-2011, first with the North Pacific Groundfish Observer Program, then with the Stock Assessment Program, and finally with the Ecosystem Modeling Program. She served as a member of the North Pacific Fishery Management Council's Gulf of Alaska Groundfish Plan Team and Aleutian Islands Fishery Ecosystem Plan Team. She has been fortunate to collaborate with many scientists on both coasts on recent U.S. GLOBEC and CAMEO projects comparing the structure and function of marine ecosystems. Sarah earned her Ph.D. from the University of Washington, School of Aquatic and Fisheries Science in 2006, her M.S from the College of William and Mary, Virginia Institute of Marine Science in 1997, and her B.A. in English Literature from Swarthmore College in 1991.
