

## Background



- December 2022 Joint Board/Council
  - Scup needed a 10% reduction in expected harvest
  - Reduced the scup federal possession limit to 40 fish and shortened the season to May 1-Dec 31

## Background



- TC used the Recreational Demand Model to evaluate state measures
- The collective state proposed measures as approved by the Board would achieve the reduction

### **Board Recommendation**



 Some states wanted the opportunity to explore a wave 1 or 2 fishery in 2024

- Because the state measures collectively met the coastwide reduction:
  - The Board Requested NOAA Fisheries to reconsider the federal measures closed season from Jan – April 30 (6-y, 3-n, 2-abs)

#### December Joint Meeting B/C Motions - Scup

DETAILS COMMISSION

Move to adopt a 10% harvest reduction for 2023 scup recreational management and adopt a 10-inch minimum size limit, 40 fish possession limit, and May 1-December 31 open season for 2023 recreational scup measures in federal waters, with the states to further modify state measures through the Commission process to achieve a 10% coastwide harvest reduction.
